SÉRGIO COSTA is a Professor of Sociology at the Institute for Latin American Studies, at the Free University of Berlin and Senior Researcher at the Brazilian Centre of Analysis and Planning, São Paulo. He has recently published *Decolonizing European Sociology. Transdisciplinary Approaches* (2010, Ashgate) with Encarnación Gutiérrez-Rodríguez and Manuela Boatca; and *Globale, multiple und postkoloniale Modernen. Theoretische und vergleichende Perspektiven* (2010, Rainer Hampp Verlag) with Willfried Spohn.

MARTA M. ELVIRA is a Professor of Managing People in Organizations at the IESE Business School (Instituto de Estudios Superiores de la Empresa). She has co-edited *Managing Human Resources in Latin America: An Agenda for International Leaders* (Routledge, 2005) and *Best Practices in HRM in Latin America* (Routledge, 2008) both with Anabella Dávila. Her articles have been published in leading journals including *Academy of Management Journal*, *Organization Science*, *Work and Occupations* or *Industrial Relations*.

JOAN MARTÍNEZ-ALIER is a Professor at the Department of Economics and Economic History at the Universidad Autónoma of Barcelona. He is a founding member of the International Society for Ecological Economics. Among his recent publications are *Rethinking Environmental History. World-System History and Global Environmental Change* (Altamira Press, 2007) with Alf Hornborg and John Mc Neill; and *Recent Developments in Ecological Economics* (Edwar Elgar Publishing, 2008) with Inge Ropke.
